

## Bough Beech SC – Open Meetings 2021 Covid Risk Assessment

Date: 21/7/21 Version: 3 Subject to revision from time to time

- Carry out a self-assessment and use a Covid test kit if in doubt. Do not come to the club if you are feeling unwell
- Do not come to the club if you have been advised to self-isolate
- Consider your own health risks. You may be more vulnerable if you have not had two Covid vaccinations. Even two vaccinations does not guarantee full protection.
- Respect the concerns of other members who may have a different risk perspective to yours.
- Continue to practise social distancing and use outside spaces where possible . Club encourages wearing of face coverings indoors.

Item	Assessed risk	Mitigation	Action
Visiting club site	Virus contamination while on site.	Competitors to perform self symptom check before attending club. If anyone is feeling unwell and could be suffering from Covid 19, the whole crew/family should not to come to site.  Visit to club is at competitors' personal risk.  Competitors are encouraged to follow social distancing customs while at the club and respect the concerns of others.	Reminder in NoRs and in communications about the event from the club.  Competitors/members asked to record visits to club by sending email to <a href="mailto:ivisitedbbsec@gmail.com">ivisitedbbsec@gmail.com</a> in order to follow Government advice
Clubhouse and galley	Contamination from proximity with other members indoors	The club recommends that competitors should continue to wear face covering indoors unless eating and drinking and maintain social distance.  Take food and drink outside if possible.	OOD to have access to PPE, cleaning/decontamination materials and to wipe down contact points inside and outside during and at end of day as appropriate
	Contamination from contact points within club	Clubhouse cleaned regularly	
	Contamination in the changing rooms.	Maintain ventilation; Clean area regularly.  Competitors are encouraged to continue changing at home or in dinghy park. Changing Marquees available as an alternative option.	

Racing and racing organisation	Risk of contamination between competitors grouped for race briefings.	Signing on and briefings to competitors to be done outside with social distancing observed if possible.

	Competitors get into difficulty on the water	Competitors to check their boat is put together properly and is seaworthy before launching. Competitors encouraged to self-help as far as possible before intervention of safety boat which will be using Covid-safe procedures. Race officer to act conservatively and cancel racing if conditions become challenging for competitors	Competitors also to act conservatively and continue racing only when well within their limits
	Risk of contamination during prizegiving	To be held outside if possible	
	Handling of Protests	Any protest hearing to be held outdoors or in well ventilated area.	
Medical	Competitor develops symptoms of Covid-19 while at Club	Suspected ill person isolated and helped to leave club as soon as possible. Notify a Committee Member ASAP and email <a href="mailto:sailing@boughbeechechsc.org.uk">sailing@boughbeechechsc.org.uk</a> who will notify local health authority.	Quick enquiry to establish which other competitors/members he may have come into significant contact with and advise them accordingly Establish if any extra cleaning needs to be done immediately e.g. of changing room
