Key Points

- Carry out a self-assessment and use a Covid test kit if in doubt. Do not come to the club if you are feeling unwell
- Do not come to the club if you have been advised to self-isolate
- Consider your own health risks. You may be more vulnerable if you have not had two Covid vaccinations. Even two vaccinations does not guarantee full protection.
- Respect the concerns of other members who may have a different risk perspective to yours.
- Continue to practise social distancing and use outside spaces where possible . Club encourages wearing of face coverings indoors.

Members must only go on the water if they are comfortable with the conditions and are capable of looking after themselves.	Members should make a point of checking soundness of all equipment before going afloat. Members must be capable of sailing in prevailing conditions and follow requirements of Club Byelaw E5 on buddy sailing Try to keep upwind of the clubhouse if at all possible so you can drift home if something breaks. Take a tow rope and if the wind is light, a paddle.
