



BOUGH BEECH SAILING CLUB

RULES

NAME AND OBJECT

1. The name of the Club is the "Bough Beech Sailing Club" and the Club's flag shall be a light green burgee bearing a leaf motif in red and purple.
2. The Club is formed to promote and facilitate the sport of sailing on the Bough Beech Reservoir in Kent.

CATEGORIES

3. (a) The Club shall consist of Honorary Members, Ordinary Members, Young Members, Family Members, Associate Members, Supernumerary Members and Fishing Members.
(b) All persons with an interest in sailing are eligible for membership.
(c) When considering nominations for membership, the General Committee will so far as may be practicable give preference to residents in the Bough Beech locality.
4. A candidate for membership shall send to the Membership Secretary a form setting out his or her name and address and any other particulars which the General Committee shall require. The particulars of candidates shall be prominently displayed in the Club premises for at least fourteen days to allow objection to be raised by

any member, which should be sent to the Membership Secretary. Should no objection be raised within this period, the candidate shall become a member of the Club. Persons who are candidates for membership have no privileges in relation to the use of the Club or its premises.

5. Any objection raised to a candidate under Rule 4 shall be considered at a meeting of the General Committee, or a subcommittee of the General Committee, duly convened for that purpose. A decision shall be taken by a simple majority of the Members present.

6. The Club on the recommendation of the General Committee may in General Meeting elect Honorary Members but the total number of such Honorary Members shall not at any one time exceed five per cent of the total number of all Members. The Membership Secretary shall give to a person elected an Honorary Member written notice of his election and shall therewith send him a copy of these Rules and upon his intimating his willingness to take up his membership he shall become an Honorary Member of the Club.

7. The Club, on the recommendation of the General Committee, may in General Meeting introduce an Honorarium to reduce the fees of Members serving on the General Committee by the equivalent amount of the current annual membership fee of an Ordinary Member, in recognition of the service provided to the Club. This reduction will be applicable only after a Member has served one year on the General Committee and will require ratification annually at a General Meeting.

8. Every Member on joining the Club implicitly undertakes to comply with these Rules and any refusal or neglect to do so or any conduct which in the opinion of the General Committee is either unworthy of a Member or otherwise prejudicial to the interests of the Club shall render a Member liable to expulsion by the General Committee provided that before expelling a Member the General Committee shall call upon him for an explanation of his conduct and

shall give him an opportunity of defending himself or of resigning his membership. The vote on a resolution for expulsion shall be by ballot and the resolution shall only be carried if not less than two thirds of the Members of the General Committee vote in favour of the resolution.

9. Family Membership. At the discretion of the General Committee, the child or children (not being over 18 years of age at the start of the membership year) and the husband or wife of an Ordinary Member may be admitted to membership of the Club upon payment by the Ordinary Member of such additional subscription as may be determined by the Members in General Meeting. Persons admitted to membership under the provisions of this Rule are herein referred to as Family Members and they will be entitled to all the rights and privileges of Ordinary Members.

Young Members are those Members between 6 and 21 years at the beginning of a membership year and who elect to become Young Members. They are entitled to all the rights and privileges of Ordinary Members except that those under 18 may not vote at a General Meeting. Entrance fees and membership subscriptions for Young Members will be at reduced rates to be determined by the Members in General Meeting. Students in full time education and over 21 years of age may apply to the Committee to pay fees as if Young Members. Any young member below the age of 18 years must be supervised at the Club by an adult at all times. This responsibility would normally be that of an Ordinary, Family or Associate Member.. Associate Members. At the discretion of the General Committee, the parent or guardian of a Young Member may be admitted as an Associate Member on such terms as may be determined by the Members in General Meeting.

Fishing Members At the discretion of the General Committee, any person who is the holder of a licence to fish on Bough Beech reservoir issued by the Sutton and East Surrey Water plc (or successor) may be admitted as a Fishing Member on such terms as may be determined by the Members in General Meeting.

Supernumerary Membership. At the discretion of, and on the unanimous vote of the General Committee, Supernumerary Members may be admitted on such terms as may be determined by the General Committee.

Temporary Membership. At the discretion of the General Committee, any adult may be granted temporary membership of the Club for a period not exceeding 6 weeks for the purpose of gaining an introduction to sailing and to the Club, during which time the Temporary Member will have only limited rights as may be determined by the General Committee from time to time.

10. Any Member may introduce a visitor as a guest provided he records the name and address of the guest in the book provided for that purpose. No Member shall introduce more than two guests in any one day (a family to be regarded for this purpose only as one guest). No person so introduced may use the sailing facilities more than four times in any one season. Prospective members may, at the discretion of a Flag Officer, use their own boat or sailboard one weekend in a season and such use shall be recorded in the log of the Officer of the Day before launching.
11. The General Committee shall be authorised to permit educational and youth organisations to use the Club property and premises, including access to the water, under the supervision of a full Member of the Club and upon such terms and conditions as the General Committee shall think fit.

FEES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS

13. The financial year shall commence on 1st January and the membership year on the 1st May in each year.
14. (a) There shall be an entrance fee payable on election to membership (except Young Members) and an annual subscription

payable on election and on each subsequent 1st May of such amount as shall have been determined by the Members in General Meeting. General Committee members may be subject to a reduction as specified in Rule 7.

(b) Any Member who has not paid the required subscription by the first day of May, or such date as the General Committee may determine, shall be requested by letter sent to his address shown in the Club books to pay the same. If the subscription, which after April 30th may be liable to a surcharge, is not paid within one month of the required date, his name may be removed from the list of Members. A member's name may be restored at the discretion of the General Committee.

15. (a) No boat may be launched without the authority of the General Committee and, in the case of boats other than Club boats or approved visiting boats, without the appropriate registration fee having been paid.

(b) Registration fees, which are payable immediately upon registration of a boat, shall be such sums as may be determined by the Members in General Meeting.

OFFICERS

17. (a) The Officers of the Club shall consist of a Commodore, a Vice-Commodore and Rear-Commodore (who shall be Flag Officers), an Honorary Secretary and an Honorary Treasurer who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting in each year to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting when they shall retire but, subject to Rule 17(aa), shall be eligible for re-election. 17. (aa) No officer may serve as a Flag Officer for more than six consecutive years, nor in any one Flag Officer post for more than three years.

(b) No candidate for election to any office (other than the retiring Officers) shall be proposed unless the name of such candidate and of

his proposer shall have been sent to the Honorary Secretary who shall display the names of the candidates in the Club House at least three weeks before the date of the Annual General Meeting. (c) An Officer may with the consent of the General Committee delegate part of his duties.

MANAGEMENT OF THE CLUB

18. (a) The affairs of the Club shall be managed by the General Committee according to these Rules. Such Committee shall apply the funds of the Club in such manner as complies with Rule 37 and shall make, vary and revoke bye-laws not inconsistent with these Rules for the regulation of the affairs of the Club. Such bye-laws shall be binding on all Members and be construed as part of the Rules of the Club.

(b) It shall be the responsibility of the Honorary Secretary (or his nominated Officer) to keep a register of Members, a register of boats and Minutes of the proceedings of the General Committee and of General Meetings.

(c) It shall be the responsibility of the Treasurer to keep a complete and accurate account of the Club's finances.

(d) The General Committee shall decide where bank accounts should be opened and determine who shall operate the accounts and sign cheques. A minimum of two signatories shall be required on all financial documents dispersing Club funds.

(e) No member of the General Committee or a sub-committee shall commit the Club to expenditure without the prior sanction of the General Committee, either expressly or pursuant to bye-laws made by the General Committee.

GENERAL COMMITTEE

19. (a) The General Committee shall consist of the Officers, ex officio, and not more than twelve Members of the Club elected by the Club in General Meeting to hold office until the conclusion of the next Annual General Meeting.

(b) Candidates for election to the General Committee shall be those Members of the retiring General Committee who shall offer themselves for re-election and such other Members whose nominations duly proposed and seconded by Members of the Club in writing have been sent to the Honorary Secretary at least three weeks before the date of the Annual General Meeting.

(c) If the number of candidates duly proposed and seconded exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, the election shall be by ballot. (d) If a casual vacancy occurs by death or resignation the General Committee may co-opt a Member to fill the vacancy.

(e) Six Members of the General Committee shall constitute a quorum providing one of those present is an Officer of the Club.

(f) Except where mentioned specifically elsewhere in these Rules, proposals and motions put to the General Committee to be voted on, will be approved by simple majority. In the event of an equality of votes, the chairman presiding shall have a second or casting vote. The chair shall be taken by the senior Flag Officer present, or if none be present, by some Member chosen by the meeting. In the case of an equality of votes, the chairman presiding shall have a second or casting vote.

SUB-COMMITTEES

20. SUB COMMITTEE FOR SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR

(a) The purchase and supply of intoxicating liquor shall be managed by a Committee of four members who shall (not withstanding any other provision of these Rules) be elected by Members of the Club at a General Meeting. The election shall take place initially within 30 days of the adoption of this Rule and then at a General Meeting of the Club in each year. The period of office of members shall be for one year, from the expiry of their predecessors' term of office. (b) For purposes other than the purchase of intoxicating liquor the General Committee may appoint sub-committees of not less than three Members of whom at least one shall be a Member of the General Committee.

SAILING COMMITTEE

21. The General Committee may depute all or any of their duties relating to sailing to a Sailing Committee consisting of the Flag Officers of the Club and such other Members of the Club being not less than four in number as the General Committee shall appoint thereto.

SUPPLY OF INTOXICATING LIQUOR

22. (a) The permitted hours for the supply of intoxicating liquor during the sailing season shall be within those permitted by law at the time.

(b) No person under the age of 18 years shall purchase or attempt to purchase or have supplied or attempt to have supplied to him intoxicating liquor within the Club premises.

(c) No person shall at any time be entitled to receive at the expense of the Club or of any Member thereof any commission percentage or similar payment on or with reference to purchases of intoxicating liquor by the Club, nor shall any person directly or indirectly derive any pecuniary benefit from the supply of intoxicating liquor by or on behalf of the Club to Members or guests apart from any benefit accruing to the Club as a whole and apart also from any benefit which a person derives indirectly by reason of the supply giving rise to or contributing to a general gain from the carrying on of the Club.

HONORARY AUDITOR

23. At the Annual General Meeting in each year there shall be appointed an Auditor whose duty it shall be to audit the accounts of the Club for the current year. A copy of the audited accounts shall be made available at the Annual General Meeting. In the event of the person appointed as Auditor being unwilling or unable to act the General Committee shall appoint a substitute.

TRUSTEES AND COMMITTEE MEMBERS

24. (a) The property of the Club shall be vested in three Trustees appointed by the General Committee and shall be dealt with by them as the General Committee may from time to time direct by resolution of which an entry in the Minute Book shall be conclusive evidence.

(b) Each of the Trustees and Members of the General Committee shall be fully indemnified out of the assets of the Club from and against all liabilities, costs, expenses, and payments whatsoever which may be properly incurred or made by him (whether alone or jointly with others) in the exercise of his duties or performance of his functions (including, without limitation, legal costs and expenses incurred in defending any proceedings brought against him in relation to the proper performance of his functions as Trustee or Member of the General Committee as the case may be).

(c) Where Trustees or Committee Members are instructed by the General Committee to enter into contracts with significant liabilities the following clause (or one with a similar effect as advised by the Club's honorary legal adviser at the time) shall be included:- "The (parties to this contract) act as Trustees (or Agents) for the BBSC and it is hereby agreed that the liability of the Trustees (or Agents) in respect of this contract is limited to the sum by which they are entitled to be indemnified out of the assets of the Club". (d) The Trustees shall hold office for a period of five years or until death or resignation or until removal from office by the General Committee. Where by reason of such death, resignation or removal it is necessary that a new Trustee or Trustees be appointed the General Committee shall nominate the person or persons to be appointed the new Trustee or Trustees. For the purpose of giving effect to such a nomination, the Secretary of the Club is hereby nominated as the person to appoint new Trustees of the Club within the meaning of Section 36 of the Trustee Act, 1925, and he shall by deed duly appoint the person or persons so nominated by the General Committee.

MEETINGS

25. (a) An Annual General Meeting shall be held each year between 1st February and 31st March inclusive on a date to be fixed by the Commodore.

(b) The business of the meeting shall be the election of Officers, the General Committee and the Auditor, the approval of the annual accounts and any other business contained in the notice of the meeting.

(c) Members wishing to raise a matter for discussion at the Annual General Meeting shall give written notice thereof to the Secretary at least five weeks prior to the meeting.

26. (a) The General Committee may at any time call an extraordinary General Meeting of the Club for any specific business, and shall do so forthwith upon the requisition in writing of any 30 Members (or, if the total membership of the Club is less than 150, one-fifth of the said total) stating the purpose for which the meeting is required. The discussion at such meeting shall be confined to the business stated in the notice sent to Members.

(b) No business shall be transacted at any General Meeting unless at least 30 Members (or, if the total membership of the Club is less than 150, one-fifth of the said total) are present in person.

27. (a) The Honorary Secretary shall at least 14 days clear before the date of any General Meeting of the Club post, deliver, or transmit by electronic mail to each Member notice of such meeting and of the business to be brought before it.

(b) At a General Meeting all Members over the age of 18 shall have one vote, with the exception of a Family Membership wherein the maximum shall be two Members over 18 who shall have one vote each. All other Members shall be entitled to attend such meetings.

28. A General Meeting may on a simple majority at any time without reason given remove any Member from any position which he or she may hold within the Club or its committees.

29. (spare)

SAFETY POLICY

30. Members sail at the Club at all times at their own individual risk. It shall be the sole responsibility of individuals to decide whether their personal competence is sufficient to go afloat and sail (to race or cruise) under the prevailing conditions.
31. The General Committee will formally review safety both ashore and afloat as an agenda item not less than once per year, and report accordingly to members.
32. The General Committee will make specific rules and guidelines relevant to the safety of the Club members' activities in the by-laws of the Club.

MISCELLANEOUS

33. A Member of any club recognised by the Royal Yachting Association may be authorised to use the premises of the Club by any Member of the General Committee. Such authorisation shall specify between which dates not being more than 14 days apart the said person may use the premises.
34. Any person not being a Member of the Club who is a competitor in any race sponsored or organised by or on behalf of the Club and any person who is a Member of the crew of such competitor for the purposes of the race is entitled to the use of the Club premises within a period of twenty-four hours before and after the race in which he is competing.
35. The Secretary or any other person who has received the authority of two Members of the General Committee may expel temporarily or permanently any person who has the right to the use of the Club premises only under Rules 34 and 35.

36. No money or property of the Club or any gain arising from the carrying on of the Club shall be applied otherwise than for the benefit of the Club or for a benevolent or charitable purpose to be nominated by General Meeting.
37. In the event of the winding up of the Club the assets of the Club will not be divided between the Members. They will be passed on to any successor organisation or club whose objective conforms with Rule 2 (promoting and facilitating sailing on the Bough Beech Reservoir in Kent) or given to a benevolent or charitable organisation nominated by the Members in General Meeting.
38. Members are expected to carry out duties as Officer of the Day, Race Officer, Safety Boat Crew and in the Kitchen and Bar as detailed by the General Committee. Failure to carry out these duties will render the person concerned liable to expulsion from the Club under the provisions of Rule 8.

39. (spare)

ABANDONED BOATS

40. (a) If at any time any subscription or registration fee payable by any Member or former Member shall be three months or more in arrears:
- (i) The General Committee shall be entitled to move the Member's or former Member's boat without being liable for any loss of or damage to the boat howsoever caused.
 - (ii) The General Committee shall be entitled, upon giving one month's notice in writing to the Member or former Member, at his last known address shown in the register of Members, to sell the boat and to deduct any moneys due to the Club (whether by way of arrears of subscriptions or registration fees or otherwise) from the proceeds of sale before accounting for the balance (if any) to the Member or former Member.

- (iii) Alternatively, any boat which in the opinion of the General Committee cannot be sold may, upon such notice aforesaid be disposed of in any manner the General Committee may think fit and the expenses recovered from the Member or former Member.
- (b) Further the Club shall have at all times a lien over Members or former Members boats parked on the Club's premises in respect of all moneys due to the Club whether in respect of registration fees or subscriptions or otherwise.

NEW RULES, AMENDMENTS AND ALTERATIONS

41. (a) Notice of any alteration or addition to the Rules intended to be proposed by a Member of the Club shall be given to the Secretary in writing at least five weeks before any General Meeting at which the same is to be brought forward, and full particulars of any such proposed alterations or additions shall be set out in the notice convening the meeting.

(b) All such proposed alterations or additions and any amendments to them which may be proposed and seconded shall be put to the vote of the meeting, and provided that on a show of hands or, if demanded, on a poll, a majority of two-thirds of the votes of those Members present and entitled to vote shall be cast in favour of any proposed alterations or additions or amendments then the same shall be deemed to be carried.

42 (spare)

43. Any dispute or difference which may arise as to the meaning or interpretation of the Rules and bye-laws or as to the powers of the officers or the validity of any election or proceedings of the General Committee or sub-committees shall be determined by the General Committee whose decision shall be binding upon all the Members of the Club.
