1. Rules

- 1.1. All races will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2025-28* as published by World Sailing.
- 1.2. The prescriptions of the RYA, the rules of the Wayfarer Class Association, this Notice of Race (NOR), and the Sailing Instructions (SIs) will apply. In the event of conflict between the rules, those of the SIs shall prevail.
- 1.3. The exoneration penalty (and advisory and arbitration hearings) of the RYA Rules Disputes Procedure will be available.
- 1.4. The following Rules will be subject to change: RRS 33; RRS 35; RRS 41; RRS 45; RRS 60.1; RRS 64; RRS A5.1; RRS A5.2; Race Signal ICF 'L'; Appendix S 11.1.

2. Eligibility and Entry

- 2.1. Entry is open to Wayfarer class dinghies
- 2.2. All entrants must be members of an RYA affiliated club or personal members of the RYA.
- 2.3. All entrants should be members of the Wayfarer Class Association for the current year. Non-class members may enter, but may not be eligible for prizes.
- 2.4. Competitors may enter online: http://www.boughbeechsc.org.uk/open-racing. Early entries are appreciated. There is a help sheet for using WebCollect here: WebCollect Help Sheet.pdf
- 2.5. Entries will be accepted up to 1030hrs on 8th November 2025.
- 2.6. Substitution of helm after the entry deadline will require a separate entry and will only be considered following written application to the race committee.

3. Fees

- 3.1. Required series entry fees are as follows: £30
- 3.2. For youth teams (helm and crew under 18), a reduced fee as follows: £20

4. Schedule

- 4.1. A briefing will be held at 1030hrs on Saturday 8th November.
- 4.2. Saturday 8th November:

- 4.3. Races are to be sailed back-to-back in two sets of two, with a lunch break ashore.
- 4.4. No warning signal will be given after 1600hrs.
- 4.5. **Sunday 9th November:** Wayfarers will share a race course with BBSC club racing. Warning signal will sound after two minutes silence is observed.

- 4.6. Races are to be sailed back-to-back
- 4.7. No warning signal will be given after 1530hrs.

5. Sailing Instructions

- 5.1. BBSC Standard Sailing Instructions apply. Supplementary SIs will apply where applicable.
- 5.2. The Sailing Instructions will be available on the Bough Beech Sailing Club website and displayed on the Official Notice Board in the clubhouse.

6. Courses

6.1. The courses to be sailed will be displayed on the course board.

7. Scoring

- 7.1. The series will be scored using the World Sailing Low Points Scoring system as in RRS Appendix A4 and Appendix A5.3.
- 7.2. A minimum of one race is required to be completed to constitute the regatta.
- 7.3. The number of races a boat may exclude from her score will depend upon the races completed as follows:

8. Prizes

- 8.1. Bough Beech SC will award prizes for 1st to 3rd place overall.
- 8.2. The Race Committee may award further prizes at its discretion.

9. Advertising

9.1. Boats shall display advertising if supplied by the Organising Authority.

10. Risk Statement

- 10.1. RRS 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury. Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.
- 10.2. The Organising Authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.

11. Insurance

11.1. It is a condition of entry that each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a level of cover adequate to cover all third-party claims.

12. Rights and Copyright

12.1. By participating in this series, a competitor automatically grants to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make, use and show at their discretion any motion pictures, still pictures, and live or recorded television and other reproductions of them during this series and of all of their material related to the series, without compensation.

13. Data protection

- 13.1 In order to manage the series, information provided by competitors will be held on a database. The management of personal information and images (as per NOR 12) will comply with the Club's Privacy Policy and Data Protection Guidelines.

Additional Information

Invasive Species

All participating boats will be expected to have met Bough Beech SC's protective procedure against invasive species before entering SES Water grounds.

Dogs

Club membership

Membership privileges are extended to visitors for the duration of the Regatta.

Catering

The galley will be open before sailing for breakfast and throughout the day for hot and cold food.

Parking

Parking is available in the Club car parks. Visiting boats should be rigged in the car park and walked down to the slipway on their launching trollies. Please note that cars are not permitted beyond the car parks. A car parking marshal may be used; visitors are expected to follow any direction regarding car and/or boat parking.
